In his book, "The Passion Code, 100 Days with Jesus," O.S. Hawkins says, "If you are like me, you type hundreds of words each day. Let me ask you a question: Are the keys you type on black, gray, or white? The truth is, most of us cannot give a definitive answer without looking at the keys, even though we look at them several times a day. The point? There are a lot of things in life we see but don't really see." Never is this fact more poignant than with the death of a loved one, and most especially, during the holiday season that inevitably follows.

Some of you reading this column today are facing this holiday season with much trepidation! In fact, if the truth were known, you'd rather just go a long, long way away, all by yourself, and stay there until it's over! You're experiencing what I call, "Your Year of Firsts!" It's the first Thanksgiving, Christmas, Easter, birthday, vacation, or special event you've had

to navigate since your loved one died. And the holiday season is not a festive time for you. You're just muddling through it as best you can. And while I won't be so arrogant as to say I know how you feel, having lost two parents, other family members, and many friends and loved ones; I can say that I can relate.

I wish I could tell you that in time your grief will go away. However, that would be a lie. While we do learn to manage our grief, it never goes away. It's always there. But I have learned that God, Who is rich in grace, mercy, and love, will send little things across our lifepath to help us navigate our grief journey. Keep reading. I want to tell you a story about a can of shaving cream.

For 99% of my adult life, I have used Barbasol Shaving Cream. To be specific, the 10oz can that's red, white, and blue! I went to the grocery store the other day to pickup a couple of cans. To my shock and surprise, they didn't have any 10oz cans. They had changed it to a

For a moment I was there. And for a moment, if only for a moment, it was real! When I came back to reality I whispered, "Thank You, Lord. Thank You!"

Sometimes, all it takes is a song, a place, a touch, or something as simple as a can of shaving cream to help you see something clearly that you haven't seen in a long, long time!

And guess what? I think my two brothers and my sister are going to get the strangest Christmas gift ever. I think they're gonna get a can of generic shaving cream from me.

My good news to you today is, with God's help, you're gonna make it through this holiday season!
