realize that Jesus left the ninety-nine sheep to rescue the one, and that He indeed taught us not to forsake the assembling of ourselves together, the fact remains, if you give me the choice of preaching to fifty people, or over a thousand, I promise you I'm going to write a thousand on the Blank Sheet ... every time!

I have heard person after person expressing how ready they are for their church to, "get back to normal." I am not! I am kind of excited about these new things we are experiencing. And in fact, I encourage every pastor, church leader, and church member to insist that the things that have been unproductive in the church for years, that are dead, stinking, and cannot be iustified, be buried! Do not allow them to soil this fresh, new, blank sheet of paper God has given us called, "The Church!" Most likely, we will never have this opportunity again. God help us not to squander it!


