A week or so ago, I preached revival services at Shiloh Baptist Church in the Penton area of Wadley, Alabama. Something happened Tuesday night that really resonated with me. I want to share it with you. Maybe it will resonate with you as well.

Her name is Cassie. She looks to be around thirty years old. Unbeknownst to me, for many years, God had been arranging the events of Cassie's life that would culminate this past Tuesday night. As you know, for some years now I have written a weekly pastor's column for several newspapers. Around ten years ago, I wrote an article that was published by the Troup County News. (I no longer write for them.) This particular column was about the children's story: "The Velveteen Rabbit." (Google: The Velveteen Rabbit.) The story explains what it means to "become real," and to be loved. This column resonated with cut it out of the newspaper want to die a 'religious'

and has kept it with her for person and go to Hell!" ten years.

Tuesday night, I used the story of The Velveteen Rabbit as a sermon illustration. Needless to say, this "coincidence," ten years in the making, immediately caught Cassie's attention! After all, what are the odds of her having the column I had written ten years earlier with her - and then hearing me use the same illustration in a sermon in a small rural church on the backside of Wadley Alabama? Only God can arrange these divine appointments! Tuesday night, the Holy Spirit of God used this "coincidence" to arrest Cassie and cause her to give her heart and life to Jesus Christ! Coincidence? No! Divine will launch, we can appointment? Yes!

As wonderful as the story above is, something else resonated even more with me about Cassie. As she came forward during the altar call, I asked her if she knew Jesus as her personal Lord and Savior. She said, "No." Then, through broken sobs, she Cassie to the point that she blurted out, "And I don't

Wow! It was as if God splashed cold water in my face! You see, saved, or lost, one day we will all launch from somewhere into our eternity - heaven or hell.

God got a hold of me and began to make me realize: We are all going to die! (It is appointed to man once to die!) We are all going to die "somewhere!" And regardless of where that "somewhere" is – it will be our launching pad into eternity – heaven or hell! We may launch from our home, our workplace, a Bible college, a church in the country, a hospital room, a hospice center, a wreck on the highway, or from a foreign battlefield. And while we will most likely not be able to determine from where we determine our final destination! So, for the first time in a long, long time, this past Sunday I preached a sermon devoted 100% to salvation! And yes, every sermon I preach has an element of salvation in it, but seldom is it devoted 100% to salvation. I was preaching Sunday at Trinity Baptist Church in Roanoke, Alabama. So, I

entitled my sermon: "Don't Die a 'Religious' Person and Go to Hell from Trinity Baptist Church in Roanoke, Alabama!"

If you died right this moment, where would you spend eternity: heaven or hell? Note: I did not ask if you: attend church, have been baptized, pay tithes, are a good moral person, sing in the choir, keep the nursery, or if you are a preacher, teacher, deacon, or some other officer in the church. I asked if you know Jesus as your personal Savior. So, again, if you died right now, where would you spend eternity: heaven or hell? There is no inbetween! And know this a "hope-so," "think-so," "maybe-so" salvation – will get you a front row seat in Hell! It has to be a "know so" salvation experience with Jesus! Tuesday night Cassie had her "know so" salvation experience with Jesus. Have you had that experience? Please! Don't die a "religious" person and go to hell!
