#### **UPHOLD LIFE**

A few weeks ago the Supreme Court issued a course -correcting decision that is sending shock waves throughout the world. As one who sides with LIFE, I applaud their decision. I also realize that as believers, we must be ready to act in the ongoing battle to **UPHOLD LIFE** in every situation.

We must uphold LIFE from conception, through the womb, childhood and teen years, adulthood, and even in our final days. We must uphold LIFE for those with special needs and those with physical, emotional, and spiritual disabilities. For those who are healthy, sick, or face debilitating injuries, incapacitated by disease or accidents, or have just simply grown more feeble with age — we must uphold LIFE at every step. (Pagelon 8.2.8 Matthews 10.20.21 Pagenon 8.28)

(Psalm 8:3-8, Matthew 10:29-31, Romans 8:28)

We must never allow the world's misguided, humanistic logic to direct us in how we understand the sanctity of every human life – from conception to death. When we devalue human life in any way, we begin a downward spiral away from God's plan and His best for humanity.

NOTE: This morning, Tuesday, July 5, 2022, I'm adding another sad edit to this important little note on the sanctity of human life. Yesterday, across our country (and world), there were many people who, because of the evil in their heart and the lack of value for LIFE and the GOD WHO GIVES IT, senselessly and recklessly killed others. The answer to this terrible problem is not in more human laws, but in a return to the respect and love for God, the Creator of Life. The answer is in a Great Spiritual Awakening. When will we realize that culture, entertainment, social media, and our best human philosophies have failed us? Only God can restore that which the enemy has ravaged. Our answer lies in God and His Word.

May we do everything we can to SERVE, SAVE, and SANCTIFY LIFE. May we speak out boldly, step up willingly, and give generously for the sanctity of every human life.
