I'm also thinking about spiritual growth. This is such a special season of the year. We've come through another wonderful Christmas celebration and now we've moved into the days leading up to Easter. Easter is "THE GREATEST DAY IN HISTORY" as the song lyrics rightly say.

Healthy, living things grow! It sounds so simple but it's true. I've only loved one cat in my life. It was a little kitten we named

Jerry because he was gray like the cat from Tom and Jerry (not after my friend Jerry Parkerson). We had him for well over a year and he was still a cute little kitten, not a grown-up cat with

So, how do we best evaluate our Spiritual Growth?

Let me give you a few questions to ask about your life:

"Is the Gospel the center of my life?"

The Gospel is the GOOD NEWS of JESUS CHRIST. That He lived obediently, died sacrificially, and was raised to life is the core of who we are! By "center of my life," I mean that everything we do is being evaluated by its Christlikeness. If I'm growing spiritually I'm becoming more like Jesus each and every day. I'm adjusting my will and ways to the Holy Spirit's direction. In a phrase, "I'm being sanctified."

"Is the fruit of the Spirit growing in me?"

Love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control. Take a look. Are these things evident in your life?

If you have a green thumb when it comes to gardening, then this should be an easy comparison for you. If your tomatoes aren't growing, something is wrong. We know the seed is good. The Holy Spirit is a fine gardener. What's left? The soil (you)...check the soil. Before the weeds begin to grow in your life this spring, make sure your habits and daily activities are such that the Spirit has the freedom to do the work in you so that the fruit can grow.

"Am I using my spiritual gifts to serve the church?"

Serving. It's the next level of spiritual growth. There's no age limit at either end. We are the body of Christ, all of us. The Church, our church's health is partly up to each of us. That is, we each have a role to play in helping our church be a healthy body. What if each member of your church took it upon themselves to serve wholeheartedly with the power given to them for just that purpose?

There are many more questions that we could ask. The important thing is that never stop asking.
