Now <u>THAT</u> is a "no brainer!" I agree. But don't dismiss that statement too fast because, like me, you probably need to remind yourself of that on a regular basis.

I hope you realize that sometimes you say far more about what you really believe with your actions than you do with your words. And, sometimes we say even more with our faces than we do with our mouth. Other times, we reveal what's going on in our mind by the things we imply with our words.

I was able to attend the Evangelism Conference in Carrollton recently and heard Dr. Emir Caner and Dr. Jerry Vines preach during the services.

Dr. Caner was preaching about the two who walked along the road to Emmaus and talked with Jesus in Luke 24. He focused briefly on verse 21 where it quotes the men saying, "But we had hoped that he was the one to redeem Israel."

He went on to say that these two men knew about Jesus and knew about what was going on in Jerusalem that weekend, but they expressed their disbelief that God knew more than them when they said these words. They didn't come right out and say that they doubted God had everything under control but what they communicated was the truth that since things didn't turn out like they "had hoped," God had somehow failed or was somehow wrong in allowing these things to occur the way they occurred.

Sometimes we do that, too.

Often, we worry, complain, grumble, or get down when things don't go our way or God doesn't answer a prayer the way we think He should. I get that. In fact, I understand it. But don't get stuck there and

let it turn into a root for bitterness to hold you captive. Be careful with that.

For others, they've got God so figured out that they've convinced themselves this is the way God wants it done and so they strike out to prove God's way is the right way at any cost, but in reality, they are trying to prove their point and not God's. Be careful of that, too.

Be clear on this simple yet profound Truth:

God **SEES** more than you and He **KNOWS** more than you.

After Jesus explained the Scripture to them, their disbelief was turned around and they became energetic witnesses to the TRUTH.

Any time you're faced with a choice between God's Word and your best thought or idea, go with God's Word. That's a no brainer, too.






